

Movements of 106 in 2010

14 October 2010

She has centred her recent activity around Ben Grian Beag in an area of 8 square km.

10 November 2010: Living at home

The female eaglet has remained living within the home range of her parents from fledging in July to this date. Earlier she was close to the eyrie with her sibling but in the last month or more has been living in an area of 34 square km compared to the larger home range of her brother (55 square km). Since the 31st October she has remained in the home range with her parents following the departure of the male eaglet.

20 November 2010: No Change

She has spent all her time in a range of 4 square km around Ben Grian Beag between 9th and 18th November. I was passing on the Kinbrace to Forsinard road on 16th November, a beautiful clear sunny morning but didn't catch a glimpse when we passed the mountain - saw ravens and buzzards, and a flock of greylag geese over the loch.



Range 13 - 18 November

27 November 2010: No Change

The female is still using same range, (2.7 square km) presumably with parents.



November 18th to 25th

08 December 2010

No change - living between Ben Griam Beag and Ben Griam Mor.

17 December 2010: No change

Still in home range.

31 December 2010: No change

The female eaglet continued to live in her parents' home range throughout December in much the same area, though on 28th December at 4pm she flew east and was located just west of Loch an Ruar near the Kinbrace to Bettyhill Road.
